

Credits towards Apprenticeship Training

The following document provides information on how many trade time hours the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission may recognize when a person indentures as an apprentice.

High School Course	Trade Time Recognition
SYA (incomplete)	100 hours per level. No financial benefit.
SYA (complete)	300 hours. Eligible for indenture fee, first year tuition and scholarships
PAA Pure Courses	100 hours
PAA Survey	70 hours
Career Work Exploration (CWE)	70 hours
Additional PAA Courses – in a designated trade and following Ministry of Education and SATCC Trade Board approval	Maximum 100 hours
Apprenticeship 20 and 30	Hours can be documented on a Form 6A for the applicable trade. These are submitted to the SATCC upon indenturing as an apprentice in this trade.
Locally Developed Courses – in a designated trade and following Ministry of Education and SATCC Trade Board approval	Maximum 100 hours

*Courses can be available in **Pure** or **Survey** courses. Pure courses are those which have 100 hours of trade specific education. Survey courses are those in which only portions of the 100 hours are assigned to specific trades. Typically the Survey courses are for Grade 9 programs or for smaller schools which do not have the facilities to provide education to entire classes at one time.

NOTE: Students who are employed outside of course hours can submit time for credit. For example, if a student is participating in CWE from 1:00 to 3:15 (school hours) they are getting trade time base upon their CWE High School Credit. If the student works after their school day is complete, they can submit Form 6A's for the work in the trade. Trade time acquired outside of school hours must be submitted on Form 6A's and all regulatory requirements apply.
