Administrators' Report

We hope everyone had a relaxing February break. February and the beginning of semester 2 have flown by. Just a reminder that on March 24th and 25th from 4-6:30 we will be hosting our second and final student led conferences for the school year. We will be using the same format as we followed in November, when 100% of our students led their conference and we look forward to the same excellent results in March.

Students in grades 1-9 who pre-registered will be heading to Elkwater on February 26th. Unfortunately our Fernie Ski Trip had to be cancelled this year for the first time ever due to poor snow conditions. We are working on arranging a more local alternate ski trip for grades 10-12 and hopefully by the time you read this that will be in place.

This month we want to share some of the things our school has done in response to the Tell Them From Me Survey that students took in December. The survey was done by all grades 4-12 students in Saskatchewan to share how they are feeling about school and ideas they have for making it even better. The information shared by students has enabled us to take some immediate action. Students in grades 6-12 are looking for more options of things to do over the lunch break so we surveyed them to learn just what they are looking for. We've taken the survey results to the staff and we are looking at offering some different things over the noon hour whenever possible. The SRC is going to try to have an elementary activity once a month (as long as their schedules can make it happen) and they are working on hosting more spirit days. We are doing all we can to continue to make our school the very best.

Teachers got together at the end of January to talk about the awards that are given out at the end of every school year for students in grades 6-12. We felt there needed to be precise criteria for staff to use to choose the winners of these awards and while marks are important, that criteria needed to be more than just top marks. We decided that we will take the students with the top five marks in each division (grade 6-9 is division 3 and grades 10-12 are division 4) and then look at student work ethic, attendance & participation, interest or passion in the

subject area and behavior. All of these areas will be rated on a rubric that has been shared with students and posted in the high school. We hope that this helps students realize what goes into earning an award and it will make staff decision making more clear.
