FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 8 - 14, 2023

The Swift Current Fire Department is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA®) to promote this year's Fire Prevention Week Campaign:

"Cooking Safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention."

Dear Parent(s) or Caregiver(s):

The Swift Current Fire Department is hosting a contest promoting the Fire Prevention Week activities. This contest requires students to complete a poster about kitchen and cooking fire safety. A poster must be returned by the students to their respective schools by Monday, October 16th, 2023. Children will be drawn by the school/teachers to win one of the great prizes listed below:

Grand Prize (Grade 3, 4, 5): Fire Chief for a Day

- One student from each school will be chosen to spend part of the day with firefighters at the Fire Department on Wednesday, November 8, 2023. They will participate in educational and fun activities, including lunch at McDonald's.
- All Fire Chief's for the day will be entered into a draw here at the Fire Station to receive either some Broncos swag or a Broncos Family Night Out, which includes a voucher to redeem 2 adult and 2 child Broncos regular season game tickets (based on availability). The Broncos Family Night Out draw prize also includes 4 hot dogs or hamburgers and 4 pops or waters to be redeemed at the concession. (There is only one Broncos Family Night Out Package available within the draw).

Grand Prize (Grade K, 1, 2): Ride to School in a Fire Truck

Cooking Safety

Cooking brings family and friends together, provides an outlet for creativity and can be relaxing. But did you know that cooking fires are the number one cause of home fires and home injuries? By following a few safety tips you can prevent these fires.

"COOK WITH CAUTION"


- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home.



Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 metre) around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

FACTS

- The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.
- Most cooking fires in the home involve the kitchen stove.
