

Leader Composite School Re-Entry Detailed Plan

The LCS Staff and Chinook School Division have been busy planning a safe yet realistic Re-Entry Plan for our students. This document is designed to provide families of LCS with a more detailed plan organized according to several categories. Each of our schools in the Division is unique and as such our plans may differ from other schools to reflect the uniqueness, diversity and local culture of our community.

Safe Attendance

1.	Students and staff who are ill should remain at home. Consult the Online Saskatchewan COVID-19 Assessment Tool for a full list of symptoms.
2.	If students or staff are showing symptoms at home that may be a COVID related symptom, call 811 and take direction from Saskatchewan Health regarding next steps or whether testing is required. Testing centers nearby are in Kindersley, Maple Creek, Swift Current.
3.	Students and staff who are ill should stay home until they are symptom free. Other family members who do not have symptoms may still attend school, but self-monitor.
4.	If a student becomes ill while they are at school, they will be asked to wear a non-medical mask and taken to an isolation room. Parents will be contacted to pick up their child and to assess and monitor symptoms. Procedures for the isolation room will be as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Physical distancing, hand hygiene required, masks worn by a designated school personnel.2. Parents contacted. Parents must remain outside of the school for pick-up3. Parents will be instructed to call 811 for direction.4. If your child has a pre-existing condition, such as seasonal allergies, please notify us in advance so that information can be taken into account when assessing a potentially ill student.
5.	If a student or staff member tests positive any communication regarding the student or further action will be done only by or with approval of the Division in consultation with Public Health.
6.	Education and training for staff and students specific to infection reduction: hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene, etiquette will be taught, modelled and reinforced.
7.	Masks are to be worn in grades 4-12 where social distancing of 1 metre can not be maintained. Masks are to be worn in common areas such as hallways, 5 minute breaks, bathrooms etc. Masks may be worn by a staff or student at any time.
8.	Students will be encouraged to bring their own cloth masks, and store them in a clean plastic ziplock (please label). Two masks have been provided for each student. Masks are available if students require one. Masks need to be laundered daily.

Safe Transportation

1.	All students will be required to wear masks on busses where 1 metre distance can not be maintained, and will sit in a designated seating plan.
2.	Students will need to sanitize their hands before and after leaving the bus.
3.	Busses will be sanitized and disinfected after each run.
4.	Parents driving their children are NOT to park in the bus loading zone. Vehicles are to park at the designated sign only (across from the tetherballs, going south).
5.	With the increased volume of parents driving their children, use extreme CAUTION when picking up/ dropping off students. It is a congested area and safe movement of our students is a priority. Parents are not to stop in the middle of the road to drop off children.

Safe Access

1.	Students should arrive no earlier than 8:40 at their designated door.
2.	All students should sanitize their hands before entering the school. Students will need to wash their hands or sanitize as they transition between activities/classes.
3.	Sanitation stations will be available at each entrance.
4.	Visitors and parents are discouraged from coming into the building. If it is urgent, parents will need to call the front office, answer a series of screening questions, sign in and out and provide a contact number. If parents are dropping off items, they will need to call the front office 628-3895 and staff personnel will meet parents outside to arrange delivery. There will be no direct parent delivery of items to students.

Safe Facilities/Classrooms

1.	Sanitizing stations will be provided at all entrances and classrooms. Proper hygiene will be taught and strictly enforced. Two portable hand washing stations have been placed at the K door and near the gymnasium.
2.	Bathrooms - only 2-3 students maximum will be able to use the bathroom at one time.
3.	Water Fountains will not be accessible. Water stations to fill water bottles are available. Students need to bring their own labelled water bottles.
4.	Enhanced cleaning of high touch surfaces will be done frequently throughout the

	day and after students leave.
5.	Microwaves ARE NOT available. Please send thermoses, disposable cutlery. There will be no sharing of food by students.
6.	LUNCH HOUR- town students should be going home for lunch.
7.	Classroom desks have been socially distanced 1 metre apart as much as possible.
8.	Materials should not be shared. Chromebooks/ computers will be sanitized after each use.

Safe Activities

1.	Grade level muster points (K- 7) have been established where students will gather (1 meter apart) to enter the school at the end of all recesses.
2.	**FIRST DAY** K-7 students are to sanitize prior to entering the school, take their materials directly to their classroom, and go directly outside for recess. Teachers will meet students at their muster points. Please note unfortunately, parents won't be coming into the building/classrooms with their children , so they will need to do first day pictures and goodbye routines outside. Staff will be available to assist carrying materials inside the building.
3.	Recess for K-7, students are to keep in their same grade cohort. Areas of the playground have been established to keep cohorts together.
4.	Shared equipment is discouraged. Equipment at recess will be sanitized after use.
5.	Gym-use of shared equipment will be minimal. Equipment will be sanitized after use.
6.	Extracurricular sports have been allowed with precautionary measures and changes to leagues and start-up procedures as outlined by SHSAA.
