DRESS CODE

Because of the warm weather to come, parents and students may need to be reminded of our school dress code indicating appropriate clothes for school.

School dress should reflect good taste and judgement. The type of dress worn by the student has an influence on the student's attitude and work and on the character of the school. With this in mind, the following guidelines should apply:

- Clothing should not be offensive to others (i.e., containing racist, sexist, or profane language or images, or

references to drugs or alcohol).

- Clothing should not be revealing or allow for excessive skin exposure.

- Head gear (hats, bandanas, etc.) and sunglasses must be removed upon entering the school building and stored in lockers.

- Students must remove wet or muddy footwear. Students should have other footwear available in this event.

- Physical Education Wear: Students should wear a change of clothes to physical education class that allows comfort, freedom of movement required by all class activities, along with running shoes that have not been worn outside. All physical education dress should respectfully meet school dress code.

Students may be asked to go home or to call their parents to bring appropriate clothing. School t-shirts are available for students to wear for the day so that they do not have to go home. Please contact the school if there are any questions.
