

No matter what kinds of tools and materials you use or what projects you like to work on, the act of creating something makes you a maker. The purpose of Makerspace


stations in a school is for students to become problem solvers, inventors, "outside the box" thinkers.

Some examples of Makerspace stations are:

- Crafts---creating with a variety of craft materials; drawing; using stencils, stamps, etc.
- Coloring---using coloring books that are very detailed with a variety of pencil crayons, markers, gel pens, etc.
- Recycled materials---cardboard, newspaper, paper towel tubes, old books, etc.
- Puzzles
- Board games
- Building/Engineering skills----using a variety of materials such as Lego, Duplo, Knex, wooden blocks, straw connectors, etc.
- Coding/Computer Programming
- **Electrical Circuits**
- Robotics
- Magnets
- Marble works---using marbles and gears to create a run or maze


Student Absences When your child is absent from school, please notify the school in the morning before 9:00 a.m. by calling (306) 778-9292. Message manager is available for leaving messages as well. If your child comes to school late, or you are picking them up early, please stop at the front office to sign them in/out.

Communication Please remember to notify your child's homeroom teacher when there is a change in plans in picking your child up after school. The school requires a note in your child's agenda planner from the parent/guardian or a phone call. For Bus Students—a phone call or note to the bus driver, as well as the school, to indicate a change of plans. (ie child is not going home on the bus.)

For your child's safety, we cannot take a student's word about a change of plans without confirmation from the parent/guardian. With combined classes in the afternoon, various teachers are dismissing the students from their homerooms so it is important that the school is made aware of any changes early in the day to avoid confusion for your child. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
