Delegation: Eastend School Students "Raising Hope Gala"

The Eastend School WE Day group attended the meeting to talk about their WE Day experiences and fundraising initiatives. They highlighted their Raising Hope Gala, where they made a goal to raise \$30,000 to adopt a room at the Ronald McDonald House in Saskatoon. The students were inspired after a tour of the Ronald McDonald House when they travelled to Saskatoon for a WE Day event last year. The event was held in Eastend with a variety of entertainment and food, as well as live and silent auctions. They surpassed their goal by far and raised over \$65,000. The Board would like to congratulate the Eastend School WE Day group of students and staff advisors on an incredibly successful fundraiser, and acknowledge the community for an impressive showing of support!

Distance Education Monitoring Report

Shelby Budd, Principal of the Chinook Cyber School

The goal of the Chinook Cyber School is to deliver courses to students, while developing personal responsibility for students as lifelong, independent learners. The Motto is "No Limits!"

Chinook sends out interest surveys every year for students to complete, and the Cyber School works with the schools to decide what classes to deliver, including new classes. The Cyber school works in partnership with Chinook schools to provide students with programming to meet high school requirements, elective courses to enhance learning opportunities, a collaborative online learning environment by providing the opportunity and the means for communication between the student and the online instructor, and dynamic courses that take advantage of the online environment through differentiated instruction and assessment.

In 2015-2016, the Chinook Cyber School offered a total of 59 courses, through a variety of methods:

- Asynchronous online delivery of courses using the learning management system (LMS) Moodle. These courses are semesterized.
- **Synchronous** video delivery of courses using video conferencing units. These classes are scheduled into the student's timetable at a specific time each day. All synchronous classes are supported with a Moodle course as well. These courses are semesterized. This delivery style is being reviewed for its effectiveness.
- CSI (Continuous Student Intake) asynchronous delivery of courses using Moodle. Students may begin the course at any time during the school year and have up to one full calendar year to complete the course. Courses close over the summer. Students may



apply for extension, though it is not recommended. CSI is not the recommended enrolment option for most students.

Highlights:

- Enrolment increased to push numbers just over 1000 seats up by approximately 200.
- 9.3 FTE 5 full-time; 10 part-time in 9 schools.
- Staffing increase of 7.9-9.3 from previous year course development, course improvement.
- 1002 seats were occupied in 2015-16, which is 201 more seats than the previous year. This includes seats in each class, so individual students would be counted for each class they are in.

Celebrations:

- 96% completion rate, which has been consistent for 3 years now.
- Teacher Assistance Teams (TAT) support for students have worked well.
- Co-hosts of provincial Distance Education Bootcamp for educators.
- Presentations at Rural Congress and Canadian School Board Association conference.
- Continued interest from outside our division, provincially, nationally and internationally to have access to our courses for resources and development purposes.
- Strong partnership with Horizon, Northern Light and Good Spirit school divisions.
- Visits to schools are always well-received.
- Moved to hosted server Lambda Solutions.
- Future goals include continuing to increase presence in schools, formative assessment, course design and online reading comprehension, a big focus on online design, building positive relationships and incorporation of Google with Moodle. New courses include: Information Processing 10, Life Trans30/IP10 double credit course, Earth Science 30, Sports Psychology 20, ELA A30 Hockey Theme, Environmental Science 20, Crop Production 10, Construction 10.

Chinook School Division Strategic Plan

In the Board's leadership role for the Division, they have committed to an annual strategic planning process. As a result, they have created and approved a school division strategic plan for 2017-19, giving direction to our schools as they do their planning for the 2017-18 year. These plans are also aligned with the provincial education sector plan.

Within the 2017-18 Division Strategic Plan, the Board has highlighted the following areas for Chinook to focus on:

- By June 2018, high impact writing instructional strategies will be implemented.
- By June 2019, strategies and structures will be researched and systematically implemented across the division to engage the 21st Century Learner.

The long-term outcomes for the overall Division Strategic Plan are:



- By June 2020, 90% of students will be meeting or exceeding Chinook expectations in reading, writing and math.
- By 2019, 100% of SCC's will have implemented a Community Engagement and Alignment Plan.
- By 2020, Chinook's 3-year average graduation rate will be 90% and the 5-year average graduation rate will be 93%.
- By 2020, 90% of Chinook students exiting kindergarten will score within the appropriate range in the cognitive domain, language and communication domains as measured by the Early Years Evaluation (EYE).
- By June 2019, the Board will have implemented strategies that will annually ensure efficiency of budget, compliance to policy and legislation, as well as alignment to the ESSP.

The provincial education sector plan was developed collaboratively with public school divisions, Catholic school divisions, Conseil des écoles fransaskoises, First Nations, Métis, Ministry of Education, school boards and students. The goal of the strategic plan is to enhance the experience and achievement of all Saskatchewan students using a Student First approach to focus our work on what matters most...the student.
