Distance Education Monitoring Report for 2016-2017

The goal of the Chinook Cyber School is to support Chinook schools in providing students with core and elective programming to supplement and enhance their high school experience. As a result, students are able to stay in their home town school and receive a more well-rounded educational experience.

The Cyber School works in partnership with Chinook schools to provide students with programming to meet high school requirements, elective courses to enhance learning opportunities, a collaborative online learning environment by providing the opportunity and the means for communication between the student and the online instructor, and dynamic courses that take advantage of the online environment through differentiated instruction and assessment.

Cyber School courses are taught by highly qualified teachers who are teaching in their areas of expertise. This provides flexibility for timetabling in schools and for the busy lives of our students. CCS makes it a priority to create supportive learning environments by setting goals that focus on learning, not just credit attainment.

In 2016-2017, the Chinook Cyber School offered a total of 63 courses (up from 59) through the following methods:

- **Asynchronous** online delivery of courses using the learning management system (LMS) Moodle. These courses are semesterized.
- **CSI (Continuous Student Intake)** asynchronous delivery of courses using Moodle. Students may begin the course at any time during the school year and have up to one full calendar year to complete the course. Courses close over the summer. Students may



apply for extension, though it is not recommended. CSI is not the recommended enrolment option for most students.

• The Synchronous delivery option has been discontinued.

Highlights:

- Enrolment increased from the previous year by approximately 140 seats to 1143.
- Teaching staff 9.3 FTE made up of 6 full-time and 14 part-time in 11 schools.
- New courses: Earth Science 30, AgTech Crop Production 10, Construction 10, Environmental Science 20, Sports Psychology 20, Information Processing, IP10/LT30, ELA A30 Hockey Themed course.
- Highest enrolments: Core class ELA classes; Elective class Native Studies 30.

Celebrations:

- 99% completion rate up from 96%.
- Communication goal has resulted in students feeling more connected to their teachers.
- Visits to schools are always well received.
- Involvement on a provincial level with the future of online learning in Saskatchewan and continue to be leaders in the province in online course design and pedagogy.

- Continued interest from outside our division, provincially, nationally and internationally to have access to our courses for resources and development purposes.

Going forward, CCS will focus on formative assessment, course design an online reading comprehension and they will continue the integration of Chromebooks with courses. Engagement strategies in conjunction with effective student communication will also help inspire student learning.

Chinook School Division Strategic Plan

In the Board's leadership role for the Division, they have committed to an annual strategic planning process. As a result, they have created and approved a school division strategic plan for 2017-19, giving direction to our schools as they do their planning for the 2017-18 year. These plans are also aligned with the provincial education sector plan.

Within the 2017-19 Division Strategic Plan, the Board has highlighted the following areas for Chinook to focus on:

- By June 2019, high impact writing instructional strategies will be implemented.
- By June 2020, strategies and structures will be researched and systematically implemented across the division to engage the 21st Century Learner.

The long-term outcomes for the overall Division Strategic Plan are:

- By June 2020, 80% of students will be meeting the Provincial expectation in reading, writing and math.
- By 2019, 100% of SCC's will have implemented a Community Engagement and Alignment Plan.



- By 2020, Chinook's 3-year average graduation rate will be 90% and the 5-year average graduation rate will be 93%.
- By 2020, 90% of Chinook students exiting kindergarten will score within the appropriate range in the cognitive domain, language and communication domains as measured by the Early Years Evaluation (EYE).
- By June 2019, the Board will have implemented strategies that will annually ensure efficiency of budget, compliance to policy and legislation, as well as alignment to the ESSP.

The Education Sector Strategic Plan (ESSP) is a province-wide plan developed in co-operation with all education sector partners, approved by the 28 school boards and accepted by the Government of Saskatchewan. The goal of the strategic plan is to enhance the experience and achievement of all Saskatchewan students using a Student First approach to focus our work on what matters most... the student.
